## RULES

- Classes open only to residents of Uley and adjoining parishes.
- Only one entry per person in each category.
- Exhibits to be placed between 8.30am and 10.30am prompt.
- No names to be written on entry cards or exhibits.
- Entry cards should be placed with the category number facing up.
- 1-25 and 32 to be grown by competitor but may employ a part-time gardener.
- Vases and plates etc. provided by exhibitors at their own risk.
- Children's entries must be unaided work.
- Entries submitted in previous years are not permitted.
- Judges' decisions are final.
- In the event of a tie-break, the winner will be the person with the highest points allocation (strongest selection of first, second and third prizes).
- Exhibits must be collected after the 3.30pm presentations. Items not taken by 3.50pm may be auctioned (unless prior written request received).**
