

Uley Annual Show 2026

Exhibitors' fees:

- * Up to 5 entries - £3
- * Every additional 5 entries - £1
- * Children's classes - free to enter

Admission to Show:

- * Adults - £1
- * Age 16 & under - free
- * Exhibitors - free

There are 12 challenge cups including the Catherine Freeth Cup for most overall entries. Presentations and raffle draw at 3.30pm.

RULES:

1. Classes open only to residents of Uley and adjoining parishes, and pupils of Uley Primary School
2. Only one entry per person in each category
3. Exhibits to be placed between 8.30am and 10.30am prompt*
4. No names to be written on entry cards or exhibits
5. Entry cards should be placed with the category number facing up
6. 1-26 & 33 to be grown by competitor but may employ a part-time gardener
7. Vases and plates etc. provided by exhibitors at their own risk
8. Children's entries must be unaided work
9. Entries submitted in previous years are not permitted
10. Judges' decisions are final
11. In the event of a tie-break, the winner will be the person with the highest points allocation (strongest selection of first, second and third prizes)
12. Exhibits must be collected after the 3.30pm presentations. Items not taken by 3.50pm may be auctioned (unless prior written request received).

8. Any wonky vegetable

(Patrick Cason Cup)

Uniformity in colour, size, shape and condition

12. 6 tomatoes (retain stalks)
13. 6 small tomatoes
14. 6 berries (e.g. raspberries)

17. 3 rhubarb stalks
18. Cucumber
19. Any other fruit

FLOWERS (Cup)

20. 6 named flowers (in a vase)

32. Harvest wreath using all natural components
33. Arrangement in any container using flowers from own garden (max 50x50cm)

Clean jars with wax disc and lid (drinks in bottles), labelled with name and dd/mm/yy
